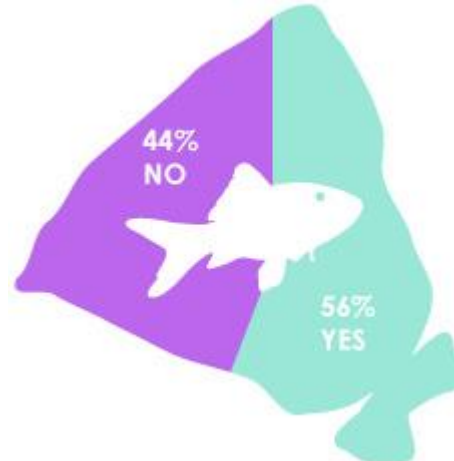
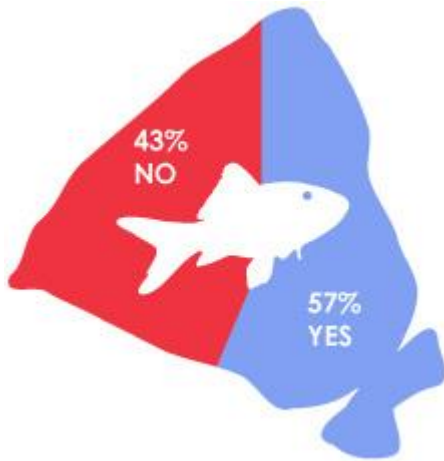

Yes 56.51% (7595)

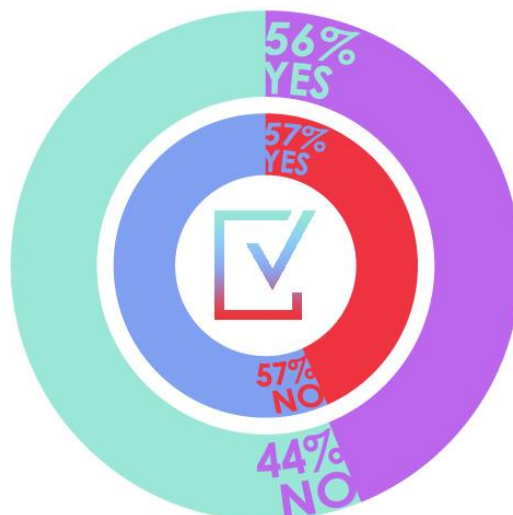
Secondary: No 44.03% (9137)

For this question primary and secondary students' votes split up almost identical.

57% of primary students voted that we could live without single-use plastic while **43% of primary students** voted that we couldn't live without single use plastic.

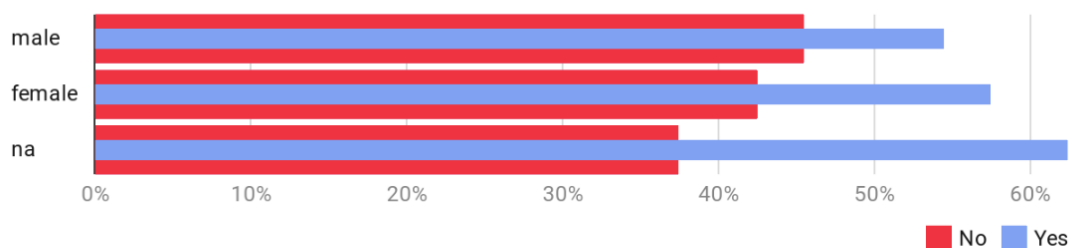
For **secondary schools, 56% of students voted yes**, we could live without single-use plastic and **44% of students voted no**, we couldn't.



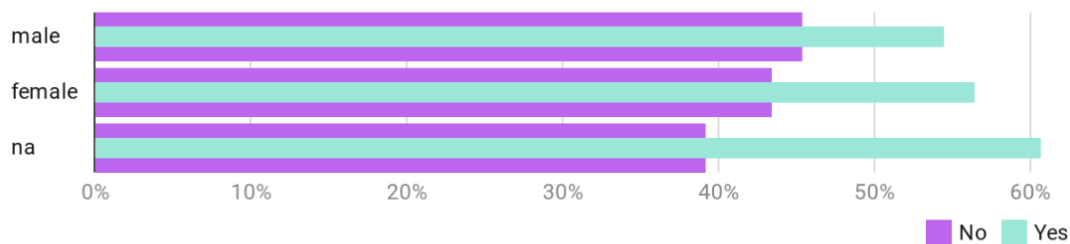


Gender

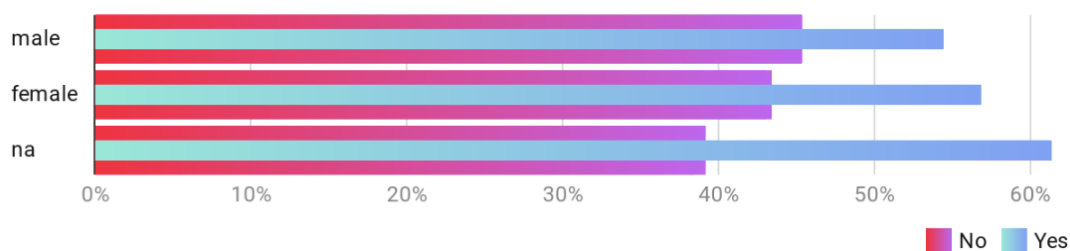
Primary

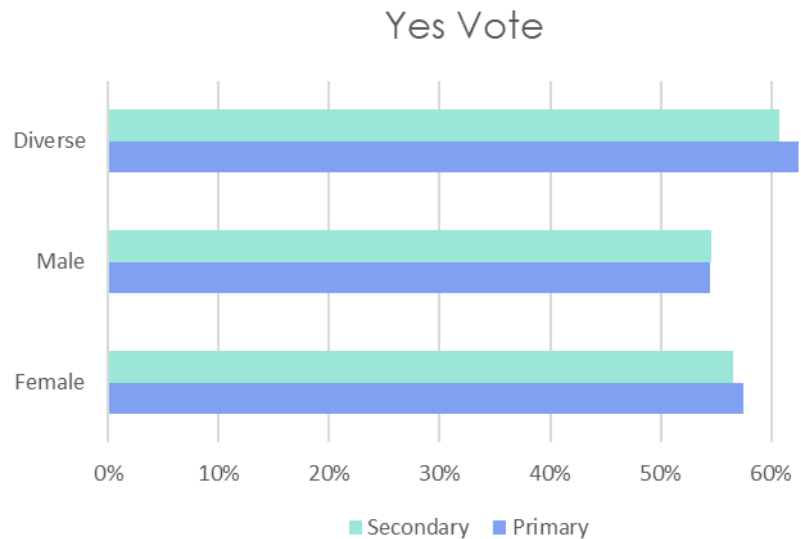

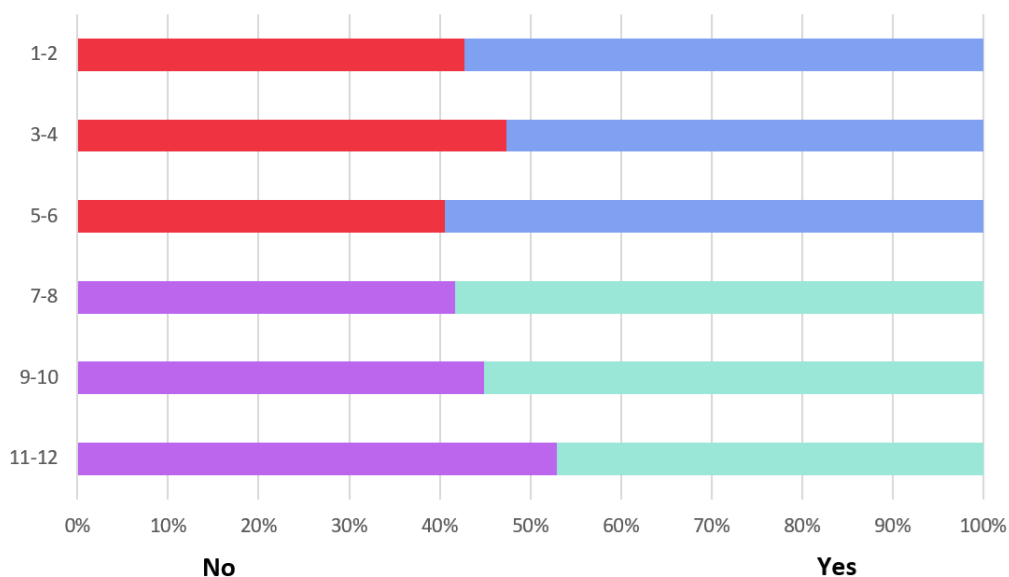
57.47% of primary females and **56.53% of Secondary females** votes **yes**, we could live without single-use plastic. Similarly, **54.50% of male primary students** and **54.52% male secondary students** also voted that we could live without single-use plastic. We found that the yes/no vote between genders was almost identical in primary and secondary schools.

62% of primary gender diverse students and **61% of secondary students** voted **yes**, we could live without single-use plastic. On the flip side **38% of gender diverse primary students** and **39% of gender diverse secondary students** said **no**, we couldn't live without single-use plastic.

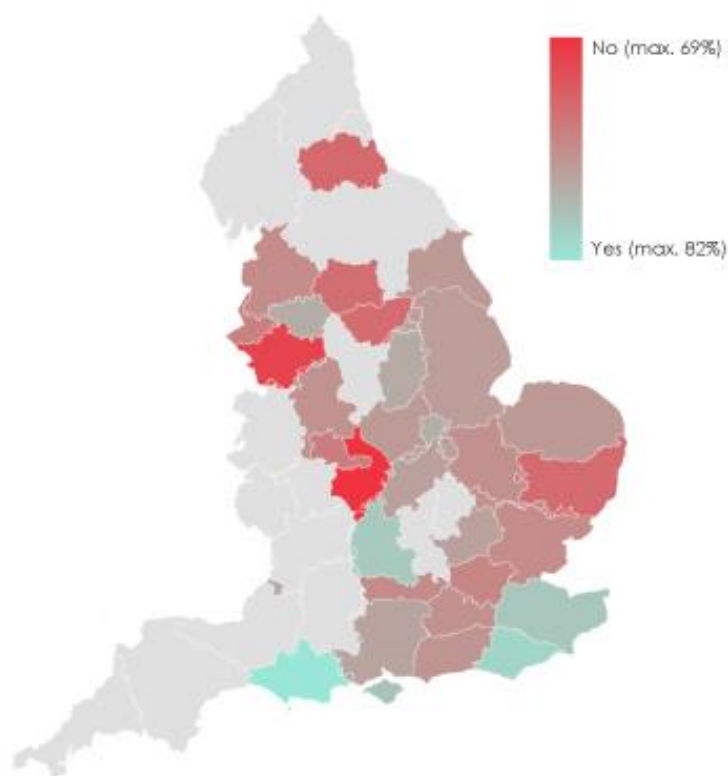
